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General Arrangement

For ease of reference and cross-reference, all the material is organized into sections and sub-sections (always, and exclusively, described by the symbol '§'); so that, for example, §14.3 forms the third sub-section of §14, and §14.3.4 forms the fourth sub-division of §14.3. These numbers are repeated in the top outside corner of each page, and exclusively used for cross-references. Running page numbers are given at the bottom of each page, but have no other function.

The individual Articles considered here are not reproduced in the order in which they appear in the instruments to which they belong, but in the order of the different sections and sub-sections of the book to which they relate (and therefore, on a few occasions, more than once). At the end of the volume, there is an Index showing where they are to be found in it. For the texts of the major instruments (other than $[AFR]^2$) in their original order, the reader is referred to I. Brownlie (ed.), Basic Documents on Human Rights (2nd ed. 1981). That work also contains the texts of some of the subsidiary instruments; many of these are also reprinted in the UN publication Human Rights: a Compilation of International Instruments.
