INTER-AMERICAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS PRESENTS INNOVATIVE HUMAN RIGHTS JURISPRUDENCE DATABASE



San José, Costa Rica, November 1st, 2023. The Inter-American Court of Human Rights is pleased to announce the launch of its innovative <u>Jurisprudence Database of the I/A Court H.R.</u>, developed with Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology and subject to a permanent editing process of systematization and analysis of the information with descriptors and metadata.

This platform has characteristics that improve the users' experience when accessing, analyzing and using the Court's Jurisprudence.

Main characteristics of the Jurisprudence Database of the I/A Court H.R.:

- Advanced Search: Allows performing smart searches and specific searches, making it easier to find specific information in a matter of seconds.
- Predictive Analysis: Linked to the Inter-American Thesaurus on Human Rights, it offers predictive analysis capabilities, thus strengthening access to legal research.
- Continuous Update: Our database is updated continuously, which guarantees that users will always have access to the latest relevant information.
- It identifies the information that is more legally relevant through automatic learning algorithms; the system learns, as it is used, to provide more reliable results.
- Connection through hyperlinks of the articles and resolutions with other documents included in the platform, which allows the user to access the desired document directly without the need to start a new search.

The President of the Inter-American Court, Judge Ricardo C. Pérez Manrique, noted that "this new tool facilitates the users' access to the Jurisprudence of the Inter-American Court and it helps to promote and protect human rights".
